1	<u>Leading Rein</u> Jumps approx. 45cm Riders 10 years and under. Cannot enter any other class Lead Rein attached to noseband	£18 MSPC members £22 Non members
2	<u>Assisted</u> Jumps approx. 45cm Riders can be assisted but NOT led. No age restriction. Riders cannot enter any other class	£18 MSPC members £22 Non members
3 *	<u>Absolute Novice</u> Jumps approx. 50cm	£18 MSPC members £22 Non members
4	<u>60cm Pairs</u> Jumps approx. 60cm	£32 members £40 Non members
5 *	<u>Complete Novice</u> Jumps approx. 60cm	£18 MSPC members £22 Non members
6 *	<u>Novice</u> Jumps approx. 70cm	£18 MSPC members £22 Non members

CLEAR ROUND JUMPING - starting at 45cm. Entries on the day. Entry fee £5 payable at the ring. Show-jumping course will increase in size as the day goes on in line with the hunter trials.

RIDERS MUST BE WEARING CORRECT RIDING ATTIRE WITH CORRECT FOOTWEAR AND UP TO DATE NON-FIXED PEAK HELMET.

All classes will be decided by an optimum time

Times: Individual competitor times for each rider will be published Friday 22nd on **Pony Club Results**

Course walk: Between 10.00am and 12.00pm on Saturday 21st March. Course can be walked on the day. (please be aware of competitors on the course and follow any instructions from stewards)

Numbers: Number bibs must be worn, you will need to print your own number. Links to print Numbers can be found on Pony Club Results when times are published. Please print 2 numbers (front and back).

Reasonable Adjustment: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Rules and Conditions of Entry

- No unattended horses to be tied outside of lorries/ trailers
- Entry to the event is deemed approval for any photographs taken at this event to be used on the website or any other promotional material by the Pony Club.
- This cross-country competition will only be held if the ground conditions permit. If in doubt please telephone the secretary. £5 will be retained for Administration in the event of cancellation.
- No stopwatches allowed. Riders must proceed directly from the last fence to the finish.
- No horse/ pony to be ridden more than once in each class.
- The judges decision is final.
- Dogs must be kept on leads in the Pony Club field.
- In the event of a withdrawal made before the closing date, entry fee will be refunded, less than £5 admin fee. Withdrawals made after the entries closing date will only be refunded, less £5 administration fee, on production of a Vet or Doctor's certificate.
- Hard hats conforming to PC standards **MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES** with chin straps done up when mounted. No fixed peaks.
- Long hair. In the interest of safety, long hair must be secured appropriately in a hairnet. Hair must not obscure the competitor's number at any time.
- Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event nor the Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other personal property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
- The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For those measures to be effective, everyone must take all the reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must over the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards and must make themselves aware of all pertinent Pony Club Rules. – Please see the Pony Club Website for relevant rules pertaining to competing in Pony Club Hunter trials.
- Competitions who are not members of the Pony Club are not covered by the Pony Club insurance and must have their own third-party cover. The Mid Surrey Branch of the Pony Club and the organisers of this event are not legally responsible for non-Members and their insurance will not cover you.
- **MEDICAL ARM BANDS:** It is the competitor's responsibility to wear a PC/BE medical armband during the cross-country phase of they have a medical condition that may impact on their care in case of an emergency. Conditions that are relevant includes serious past injuries/ surgery, chronic health problems such as diabetes, long-term medication and allergies. If in doubt competitions should consult with their own treating physician. Cards must contain the competitor's details where and indicated and must be worn on the competitor's arm or shoulder in such a way as to be visible at all times. It is not compulsory for competitor's without any medical condition to wear a medical armband providing there is an adult supporter with them. Arm bands can be purchased from the secretary on the day for £5.00.
- The courses may be walked between 10.00am AND 1.00pm on the Saturday before the event. The gates will then be locked. The course may be walked on the day of the competition but please watch out for competitors on the course. Be aware and obey all steward instructions!
